WOMAN PLEADS NOT GUILTY TO FALSE PRETENSE CHARGE

Bondsman Withdraws from Bail Bond and Prisoner Is Remanded to Jail-Trial Is Set

Lillian B. Peters, or Mrs. V. E. Arensen, who was arrested several days ago on a complaint sworn to by Miss Margaret Orth, charging her with obtaining money under false pretenses

for singing and dancing lessons for a concert which existed only in the mind of Mrs. Arensen, appeared in

Police Judge Williams' court yesterday and entered a plea of not guilty to the charge. After she had entered her plea one of her bondsmen, John A.

Finnall, arose and asked to be relieved of his duty as a bondsman and that his name be stricken from the bond. This was done and Mrs. Arensen was

sent back to jail. The young husband of the accused, who was in court, hurried out of the court room to find another bondsman to sign his name to the \$100 bond. Up to late yesterday afternoon he was unsuccessful.

Mrs. Arensen's trial was set for 3 o'clock December 7.
