

Alienation Verdict Stands

Mrs. Ullrey Refused Re-opening of \$50,132 Judgment

For the third time Mrs. Jessie Ullrey, a wealthy widow, failed yesterday before Justice Tierney in the Supreme Court to reopen a judgment for \$50,132, which Mrs. Lillie Aresoni obtained against her in April, 1920, for the alienation of the affections of Enrico Aresoni, an opera tenor.

Twice before Mrs. Ullrey has sought to set aside the verdict so that she could put in an appearance and defend the action which she failed to do when it was called for trial. In one instance the Appellate Division affirmed the action of the Supreme Court in refusing to reopen the case.

The testimony in the case was that Mrs. Ullrey alienated Aresoni from his wife and induced him to go with her to San Diego, Calif. The defendant has become heir to considerable property by the death of her mother, some of which is in New York and now becomes subject to execution under the judgment of Mrs. Aresoni.
